PLATES from BOLJETIN SITE

Roman fortress Boljetin, usually assumed as Smorna, together with necropolis, has three phase of living, from the 1-st to the 6-th century. Plates were not identified in large numbers in Boljetin. They can be shared in ten types, in the period from 1-st to the 4-th century. "Finer" forms of plates, as imitation of terra sigillata, Drag. 17 and 32, are single finds. The main goal of this paper is to show that the plates from the roman fortress Boljetin represent significant exibit and very popular attraction for many tourists.
